
You will still have trials and hardships but you see God's purpose and sovereignty behind every experience





"Victim-like"






You neglect the Bible and only focus on your trials. The difficulties and sufferings shape the way you see God, rather than trusting in God's Word for how God reveals Himself




Afflicted, perplexed, persecuted, struck down, weak, calamities, insults, and hardships



When we attempt to control what is God's responsibility, it results in anxiety, frustration and disappointment.





Manipulation: "Hop in the tank with me"


Intimidation: "Get out of my way"

Destruction: "I am running you over"


Kingdom of God

Repentance:

Contemplation Remorse Confession Restitution Reconciliation

Forgiveness:

I promise I will not bring it up to others, I will not bring it up to myself, I will not bring it up to you, unless it would be for your benefit.



The Goal

¹⁵ I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

²⁰ "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹ that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²² The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³ I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me.



Why Not?

- ➤ "As believers, we hunger for both greater Christlikeness (to be less selfish) and for deeper relationships (to feel less isolated). That these two desires work in tandem shouldn't surprise us; God created us for relationships.(p. 236)"
- ➤ "God is a community and we as his creation reflect this quality.

 Moreover, he brings us into community and places the desire for community within us. Ultimately, we can never escape our essential nature, who and what God designed us to be. This relational characteristic is central to who we are . . . you cannot talk about human beings made in God's image without talking about relationships. Yet it is often the first thing we overlook.

 Only when human beings live in community do we fully reflect the likeness of God. (p. 237)."



The Power of the Gospel for Personal Change

Why Not?

- > "At one level we want friendships. At another level we don't want them! In creation, we were made to live in community, but because of the fall, we tend to run from the very friendships we need. Quite often, our longing for them is tainted by sin. We pursue them only as long as they satisfy our own desires and needs. We have a love-hate relationship with relationships!"(p. 237).
- > "Of course, renewed relationships are not only the result of God's transforming grace, they are also a means for transformation. God uses relationships as tools for changing our lives [C.S Lewis says] 'The Church exists for nothing else but to draw men into Christ, to make them little Christs. If they are not doing that, all the cathedrals, clergy, missions, sermons, even the Bible itself, are simply a waste of time. God became Man for no other purpose. It is even doubtful, you know, whether the whole universe was created for any other purpose.' The goal of redemption is to make you a "little Christ." God wants to renew his image within you. But spiritual renewal doesn't happen in isolation from others. It happens in relationships.. (p. 238).





Obstacles to Community: Individualism



"Most of us spend our lives talking and thinking about ourselves. Apart from grace, we are hopelessly narcissistic and self-focused. We admire self-made people and covet the independence we think we see in them. We build our lives with the brick and mortar of self-interest and erect monuments to our own delusional self-esteem. Such attitudes are both foreign to Scripture and deadly for relationships. They produce only estranged siblings, broken vows, shattered marriages, alienated children, sour friendships, split churches, and warring nations.


Busyness

"The requirement for true intimacy is chunks of unhurried time. If you think you can fit deep community into the cracks of an overloaded schedule—think again. Wise people do not try to microwave friendship, parenting, or marriage. You can't do community in a hurry. If you want authentic community, you will have to do less of something else." (p. 242).



How Do We Get There?

Community: Summary From Ephesians 4

- 11 And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers,
- 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,
- 13 until we all attain to the <u>unity of the faith</u> and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ,
- 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes.
- 15 Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ,
- 16 from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

Speaking The Truth in Love

- :As it turns out, however, "'Speaking the truth in love' is not the best rendering of his expression, for the Greek verb makes no reference to our speech. Literally, it means 'truthing . . . in love,' and includes the notions of 'maintaining,' 'living,' and 'doing' the truth." (p. 249).
- "This balance of truth-plus-love is crucial. As Tim Chester writes, "Love without truth is like doing heart surgery with a wet fish. But truth without love is like doing heart surgery with a hammer." We must embody truth, not just express it. So truth, fused with love, is incarnated in our lives as we live it out with one another. Paul David Tripp concurs: "God transforms people's lives as people bring his Word to others The combination of powerful truth wrapped in self-sacrificing love is what God uses to transform people." (p. 249).

Transformed in Community: Get Together

- 1 Pet 4:8-10 "8 Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. 9 Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. 10 As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace"
- Rom 15:5-7: 5 May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, 6 that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. 7 Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

Transformed in Community: Show Love

 Col 3:12-13: "12 Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, 13 bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive."

Transformed in Community: Share Truth

• 1 Thess 5:9-11: "9 For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, 10 who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. 11 Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing...

Transformed in Community: Confront Sin

• Heb 3:12-14: "12 Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. 13 But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. 14 For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end.

Transformed in Community: Stir Up

 Heb 10:24-25: "24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Revelation 7:9-12

• ⁹ After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, ¹⁰ and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" 11 And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹² saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."
